Essential Questions

Why is Spanish important? How can I use and enjoy Spanish in everyday Life? How can I deepen my understanding of Spanish-speaking cultures? How can I develop my creativity to produce beautifully crafted projects? How can I develop my Spanish skills for College and for my Career interests?

Course Description

The Spanish 2 Course is about using and enjoying the Spanish language in real-world situations. It is also about sharpening verbal, written, and aural proficiency in the Spanish language in preparation for College and Career interests. Some students may utilize this course to prepare for the SAT Spanish Subject Test and/or the Spanish Advanced Placement (AP) Exam for College credit. The course is also about deepening cultural understanding of the Spanish-speaking world. These aims will be met primarily through the creation of beautiful, thematic project work. Students will also utilize various texts, supplementary materials, and technological tools to create a digital portfolio (DP) of their growth in language, culture, and creativity. This portfolio may include exemplary artwork, photography, music, creative writing, thematic papers, performance pieces, interactive media or any work that expresses the student's growth in language and culture. The portfolio, and the projects, will be evaluated through individual and group conferences throughout the term. In addition, weekly grammar/ vocabulary / culture quizzes will accompany the thematic projects throughout the semester. Homework will be assigned regularly during the week. A variety of cultural field trips, cinema, art, and activities will help the course come alive. The class will also journey through the world of Spanish through interactive media and virtual field studies.

Course Goals

To function in a Spanish-speaking culture; to expand communication skills for further education or the workplace; to apply the role of the Hispanic culture in a global context; to sharpen critical thinking skills by examining issues of conflict and cooperation in the Spanish-speaking world; to use current technology tools and develop technological literacy through project-based learning; to set new personal standards of academic and creative achievement; to prepare for College language courses; to prepare for the SAT Spanish Subject Test and/or Spanish Advanced Placement (AP) Exam; to use the language for a lifetime of personal enjoyment.

Course Activities

The pursuit of these goals will include individual and group projects, grammar exercises in preparation for the SAT Spanish Subject Test and/or the Spanish Advanced Placement (AP) Exam, group dialogues, role-playing, reading comprehension, writing exercises, vocabulary-building, games / drills, pronunciation practice, listening comprehension, cultural immersion, geographical analysis, cartography, cyber-journeys, musical expression, dance, art, costume design, and portfolio creation...just to name a few!

Standards and Policies

A passing grade in this class is a minimum requirement for graduation from HTHNC. This class is fully recognized as a required world language element by the University of California Admissions Office. Please come to class prepared with completed homework and all class materials. Behavior that is disruptive, or that prevents any student(s) from learning, is unacceptable and will not be tolerated. Trust and respect are the keys to enjoying our journey through the world of Spanish...respect yourself, your peers, your teacher and our space...and all will be well. Homework will be assigned regularly during the week. It is the student's responsibility to back up all of their work each day on their required flash drive. Please bring your flash drive each day to class. As each project is completed, students must post their products on their DP for presentation.

Late work will not be accepted except in cases of illness or a family emergency. If absent, the student is responsible for getting the assignment via email, from Señor G's DP or from a friend. The assignment is due (or the test / quiz must be taken) within the number of days that you missed. The use of translation websites to produce written work is prohibited. Poor behavior will affect the student's overall grade and may prevent one's participation in field trips and other class activities
